Highlighting One of our Vocational Missionaries

Karina was our very first vocational missionary! She lives and works in Budapest, Hungary. We asked her to share about her life and ministry there.



1. *Tell us a little bit about your journey that brought you to minister vocationally in Budapest.* I decided to move to Budapest, Hungary to be closer to my grandparents. I was hoping to work in a larger city for a number of years and I'm a dual citizen of Hungary and the US, so when I was laid off from my job in the US, it offered me the perfect opportunity to see what life in Hungary would be like! I'm currently working as an administrator of an international K-12 school.

2. *What has been your biggest challenge working vocationally there?* My biggest challenge has been understanding Hungarian culture. I assumed that I already knew all there was to know about Hungarian culture since my parents are Hungarian. But since I've been living here, I've learned a great deal more about the culture, such as the pervasiveness of cynicism. But that is all the more reason to bring the hope of the gospel! The majority of my coworkers are American, so thankfully much of the tension has been living in Hungary instead of from work itself.

3. *What has been your most difficult cross-cultural experience?* I am near fluent in Hungarian but I still speak with an American accent, so I have been frustrated when people automatically switch to English when I speak to them first in Hungarian. But it's just motivation to improve my Hungarian!

4. *What has been your most rewarding experience since moving to Hungary?* My most rewarding experiences have been when I am able to share why I've moved to Hungary. Many people don't understand why I would leave the comfort (and income I had) in the US to move here, but that conversation opens up the avenue to talk about my faith and hope of ministering to the Hungarian people. I am also grateful to be closer to my grandparents and minister to them, a reality I did not have while growing up in the US.
