## 2. How do I develop a ministry using my overseas job as a missions platform?

- Realize your need for community.

You will partner with a team or global partner, already-established in their location. The teaching, networking, and collective public witness of the team is a powerful gospel picture.

In your job, you'll begin by getting to know your co-workers and learning their needs and desires. Fruitful ministry will come through your desire to fellowship, cooperate, and witness to these co-workers.

- Have optimistic and realistic expectations
- Understand why business for missions is such a good thing. You will have the opportunity to reach folks, inside your company, that the team would not normally have access to.

## 3. Who can help me explore my job and ministry aspirations?

There will be one-point person who will communicate with you about getting to a field. The point person will help you in all aspects of your exploration. They will help you find a team and once the team has invited you to join them, the team, also will help you as you explore your job and ministry aspirations. There also may be people in your life, pastors, friends, family who can help.

## 4. How can I benefit from other people's experience in these areas?

Everyone needs community, accountability, and help in ministry. The Team will be there to share their past struggles and what they have learned. You will benefit, greatly, from their experiences and you will grow as they hold you accountable and learn from you. It is a rare individual who can

work a 40+ hour work week, in a new culture, and sustain themselves and their family without community that you will get from being part of a team.
